



Part-time Spanish Teacher Job Description

Tri-State Christian School is seeking a part-time Spanish teacher. This position would begin in August of 2022 and run concurrent with the 2022-23 school year. The salary for this position is based on a 70% FTE and will range from \$16,799 to \$23,500 depending on education and experience. A tuition discount for children attending Tri-State is also available. There may be an opportunity for this position to split into two positions teaching K-6 Spanish and 7-12 Spanish. Qualifications and Experience

The ideal candidate will have earned a B.S/B.A. Degree in Education with successful student teaching experience and/or a degree in Spanish with experience in education. The candidate should have a definite call to teach in a Christian School. In addition, the candidate must be a mature born-again Christian believer, capable of modeling exemplary Christian character and leadership befitting a teacher of a Christian school.

1. Exemplary people skills.

6. The ability to sign the TSCS Statement of Faith and Professional Code of Conduct

8. The ability to pass a mandatory background check.

The main duties and responsibilities of the position include but not limited to:

1. Study, pray and seek out God's direction in their teaching ministry while employed at TSCS.
2. Under the direction of the principal, be responsible to carry out the instructional programs, policies, and procedures of the school.
3. With input from the principal, prepare and implement a personal plan of spiritual, professional and personal growth.
4. Work cooperatively and interact well with the principal, staff, parents and others concerned with students.
5. Work toward achieving curriculum objectives with the principal.
6. Review lessons and student evaluation results to determine if student needs are being met.
7. Determine the effectiveness of his or her own teaching performance through self-evaluation and reflection.
8. Maintain a classroom atmosphere that is conducive to learning.
9. Teach effectively, a full range of students, Spanish from kindergarten-high school.
10. Develop the Spanish program.
11. Develop spiritual maturity of each student through integrating, applying, and communicating Biblical truth.
